Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you to all those parents who took the time to complete the Tell Them From Me Survey for 2019. We had 62 responses, which represents about one third of our families. A great response! Planning for next year is underway and we look forward to incorporating the feedback we receive from our community. The report should be ready in a week or two. We are just waiting on the company that runs the survey to finish vetting and collating the responses.

The School Band Demonstration Assembly has been held, as has the Parents' Information Evening held on Monday. Next Thursday is the Band Fitting Day where students who wish to be part of the band, work with School Bands Australia to decide on the best instrument for them.

### **Dymocks Special visitors**





# Learning Snapshot Focus on Creative Arts

## Students have been learning a range of new skills during Creative Arts lessons.

Creative Arts gives students learning experiences in the visual arts, music, drama and dance. They have opportunities to explore their creativity in each of these areas as well as learning to appreciate the meaning and value of each art form. Our school offers a range of performance groups that target areas of the creative arts including three dance groups, debating, choir and recorder performance groups.

### Kinder

Kindergarten students love making and creating artworks. They have eagerly begun working towards the Kindergarten Christmas Assembly where they will sing and dance. Students are also enjoying learning about celebrations. This history unit is tying into our art with students decorating lanterns for Diwali and masks for Halloween.



### Stage 1

Stage 1 have been creating artworks that relate to their Science unit of work "Up Down and All Around". Students are using a variety of art resources to complete their work.

### Stage 2

Stage 2 classes have been participating in visual arts activities related to their English Novel 'Charlotte's Web'. This week they divided paper into eighths and drew curved lines between the sections to create a spider's web. Brightly coloured crayons and oil pastels were used to colour in the sections to create a desired effect. Take a look at some of our finished artworks!



### Stage 3

Classes have been exploring pencil drawing techniques. They have investigated some technical skills that artists implement, including the use of fine patterns to represent colour and texture. Students have also studied the mathematics behind perspective drawing and practised drawing a street scene that disappears into the distance.

### Year 6 Polo shirts / Jackets 2020

If your child will be a Year 6 student in 2020 you can now order a Year 6 polo shirt and / or Year 6 jacket for next year. We're ordering in 2019 so your child will receive his / her shirt as early as possible in the new year. The shirts are blue and white with a 'mesh' polyester fabric. The names of the Year 6 students will be screen-printed on the back in white and the front of the T- shirt will have the school crest positioned on the upper right hand corner.

The fleecy bomber jackets will be the same as this year's jackets, in the school colours of blue, white and maroon with school crest on the front and 'Graduating class of 2020' on the back.

The cost of the polo shirts is \$32 and the jackets are \$40. When you place an order a minimum deposit of \$16 per polo shirt and \$20 per jacket must accompany the order.

The full balance must be paid in 2020 prior to receiving your order.
