#### Principal's Message

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

I am so proud of our students! All of them have settled in really well to the routines and expectations of school life. It is so lovely to see their smiling faces when they arrive and to hear their laughter during break times. We are maintaining our Covid safe routines as outlined in our last newsletter and all members of staff are fully vaccinated. While life will probably never return to pre-Covid normal, at least a few things are getting close to it!

**End of Year Reports** You will receive your child's Semester Two report at the end of this term. As per Department guidelines, it will be a simplified version of the report you normally receive. For those of you who were with us last year, the format of the report will be very similar to the one that went home at the end of Semester One 2020. For obvious reasons it would be unprofessional and presumptuous of us to report on aspects of your child's learning that we have no real data on due to the extended Learning From Home period. If you have any concerns about your child's progress, please call the school to make an appointment to speak with your child's teacher.

**School Sport** The Department has issued the following guidelines on school sport for Term 4: \* School sport can proceed while maintaining cohort bubbles. External providers are permitted provided they are fully vaccinated.

\* Inter-school sport (eg PSSA) and school/inter-school carnivals cannot proceed.

**Special End of Year Celebrations** The department has now indicated that schools may go ahead with planning for events such as Year 6 Farewells and Presentation Assemblies. However, at this point, parents will still not be allowed on site. NSW Health is continually revising its guidelines, so it is entirely possible that things may change as we get closer to the end of the year. In the meantime, we are investigating the possibility of recording or live streaming at least part of our special events.

**Kindergarten 2022** We are currently taking kindergarten enrolments for next year. Children who turn 5 before 31st July 2022 are eligible to enrol for the school year commencing on February 1st 2022.

All enrolments – whether in or out of area – can now be made online. Alternatively, if you would prefer to complete a paper copy for enrolment, please call the office on 9622 2659 to arrange a time to pick one up. If you have friends, family or neighbours who have little ones of kindergarten age, please let them know that we are taking enrolments. The sooner they enrol, the better we can plan for their child.

#### **Consideration for Our Neighbours**



Sadly, we have received several complaints from our neighbours in both Frederick and Turner Streets about the selfish and dangerous behaviour of some parents during drop off and pick up times.

The complaints include; parking across private driveways, parking dangerously and illegally, blocking the turning access in the cul-de-sac, pulling up in the cul-de-sac turning area to pick up children. As far as pedestrian behaviour is concerned, complaints include; congregating in private driveways and out the front of properties for prolonged conversations, not following Covid safety recommendations such as social distancing, calling out to each other across the street.

Please show consideration for our neighbours. We know that everyone is happy and excited to be returning to normal but please don't use drop off and pick up time as an excuse to socialise. Maintain social distancing and find a more appropriate time and place to get together and have a chat. Also, please don't try to drive right up to the school gates to collect your children. Park down the street (legally) and walk up to the the gate to collect students. While waiting for them, keep your voices at a reasonable level and maintain social distancing guidelines.

Finally, we have also noticed that some drivers, who are collecting students, are breaking the law with regard to where children are allowed to sit in cars. All children between 4 and 7 years must sit in the back seat and each must have a seat belt. If there are too many children for the back seat, a child who sits in the front passenger seat and who is between 4 and 7, must have a properly fitted booster seat and must be fitted with a seat belt.

Our neighbours have indicated that if things don't improve, they will be asking Council to send rangers to issue infringement notices. We are sure that as a community, we can do better and can be respectful of others.

Thanks for your continued co-operation, understanding and commitment to working with us in order to keep our children safe.

#### **News from Seven Hills High School**


Students enrolling at Seven Hills High School for Year 7 2022 have the opportunity to apply for the Self Select program.

















## What has 2P been up to?
