Dear Parents and Carers

The staff and students have certainly hit the ground running since returning in Weeks 3 and 4! The children in particular need to be commended on their behaviour and adherence to the COVID safety protocols we have put in place across the school. I am so proud of them!

As we advised via social media, all NSW schools are now operating under Level 3 restrictions. Briefly, what this means for our community is as follows:

Vaccinations No adults are allowed on site unless they are fully vaccinated with two doses. Only those adults who are directly involved in delivering the curriculum or assisting in the operational running of the school are allowed on site. This includes: visiting allied health providers, uniform shop personnel, canteen personnel, incursion performers where the incursion is related to the curriculum, music instructors etc. Parents and all other adults may only come on site with the approval of the Principal. OOSH parents may come on site to drop off and pick up children. They must not approach the facility without approval from the supervisor.

Masks All adults are to wear masks indoors at all times except when eating and drinking. It is not mandatory for children to wear masks, however they are encouraged to do so for their own and others' protection.

Cohorts Our bubble protocols and split recess and lunch times will continue in order to minimise contact between children. For this reason, student lunch and recess orders must be made online. There are no over the counter sales.

Orientation Sessions Will be allowed provided mingling/contact between cohorts is minimised. High schools may offer alternatives to usual orientation sessions due to the delayed start to the Higher School Certificate. We will be going ahead with a pared down orientation for our 2022 Kindergarten students (see details later in the newsletter).

Graduations and Presentation Assemblies These can go ahead provided cohorts/bubbles are maintained. Parents will have very limited access – usually limited to them attending only if they have a specific role to fill in the actual presentation. Formals held at external venues must follow the venue's Covid Safety Plan and protocols.

Covid Negative Testing Students and staff cannot attend school if they are exhibiting flu-like symptoms, even if the symptoms are mild. Students with symptoms will be isolated in sick bay and parents will be called to come and collect their child. Children cannot return to school unless:

- They have isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available OR
- They have received a negative Covid-19 test result AND are symptom free

Where a student has other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from the family GP is sufficient to cancel the need for a negative test. A Rapid Antigen Test result is not acceptable proof that a child does not have Covid -19 because the test result (which must be sighted by the school) does not have the child's name printed officially.

Other News ...

Kindergarten 2022

We are **currently taking kindergarten enrolments for next year**. Children who turn 5 before 31st July 2022 are eligible to enrol for the school year commencing on February 1st 2022. All enrolments – whether in or out of area – can now be made online. Just go to our website:

and click on the tab at the top of the page called ENROLMENT. Alternatively, if you would prefer to complete a paper copy for enrolment, please call the office on 9622 2659 to arrange a time to pick one up. If you have friends, family or neighbours who have little ones of kindergarten age, please let them know that we are taking enrolments. The sooner they enrol, the better we can plan for their child.

Kindergarten Orientation

While orientations can go ahead, we are restricted in what we can and can't do. At this stage we are planning the following:

- New Kindergarten students will have two orientation sessions 2 x Thursday afternoons on 2nd and 9th December. One fully vaccinated parent can escort child on site and pick up upon finishing.
- Kindergarten 2022 Parent Zoom with school personnel 6pm on Thursday 2nd December.
- Information packs containing school specific and Department of Education material

School Hours Reminder

The school learning day starts at 9.00am sharp in the morning and ends at 3.00pm in the afternoon. PLEASE be on time dropping your child off at school in the morning. Late arrivals tie up personnel at the gates and are a disruption to class routines. Similarly, being late for pick up in the afternoon or leaving it till after 3.00pm to notify the school that a child needs to go to after school care, also ties up personnel at the gates as well as using up their valuable time supervising uncollected children. Teachers have families too.

The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held at our school on the morning of **Wednesday 17 November, 2021.** Students must arrive at school by 9 am. Parents should have received by email a 'Test authority' letter which students are required to bring as a printed copy on the day of the test. The Opportunity Class Placement test will be run in the school's computer room and will be supervised by Lynwood Park PS staff. Please contact the school office if you require further information.

Check-in Assessments Online

Our students in Years 3-6 have been participating in a reading and numeracy Check-in assessment with their classes this week.

The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessments supplement existing school practices and provide teachers with prompt information that assist them to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Some classes will complete both assessments this week and others will complete the 2nd assessment next week.

Students may receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom.



Selective High School Applications for Year 7 2023

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2023, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 10 March 2022.

Applications open on 19 October 2021 and close on **17 November 2021**. You must apply before the closing date as no late applications are accepted.

You must submit only ONE application for each student. Please also return the Intention to Apply note, which students received this week, to school.






Stage 3 Term 4

Creative Arts – Some Birds


We read a story by Matt Spink which was our inspiration to do some bright and colourful bird art work.


Remembrance Day Thursday November 11th 2021
