Dear Parents and Carers

Another great start to the term. The children are settled and excited to have relative normality returning to their learning and school life, with lots of opportunities for extra-curricular activities coming up.

Tell Them From Me – Student Survey The student survey for children in Years 4 to 6 has closed with almost 100% participation. Thank you to parents for providing their permission for students to complete this important information gathering survey.

NAPLAN and Check In Assessments Check In Assessments (for students in Years 4 and 6) have commenced and are due to be completed next week. NAPLAN testing will be held across Weeks 4 and 5 of Term 2 and is conducted for students in Years 3 and 5.

Greening Australia Grant Our school has been successful in being selected to participate in Greening Australia's 'Cooling the Schools' program. In partnership with Greening Australia, School Infrastructure NSW and the Department of Education are working closely with the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment to plant trees in NSW government schools. As part of the grant we will receive over 100 native trees and shrubs to plant in our school grounds with Greening Australia providing the plants and hole digging labour. Our Stage 3 students will be working with Greening Australia to plant all of our new trees and shrubs. We are very excited!

P&C Mothers Day Stall On Friday of Week 4, our P&C will be holding a Mothers Day Stall for the children to be able to purchase gifts for their special mums, aunts, grandmothers and carers. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to independently select a gift for the people they love. The items are reasonably priced with a variety of gifts to choose from. National Walk Safely to School Day

Friday 14th May 2021

Walking advice for parents and carers



Always hold your child's hand when walking on the footpath, in the car park and when crossing the road - until they are at least 8 years old.

When your children are between 8 and 10 years old, supervise them very closely when they are near traffic and crossing the road.

Children are vulnerable in the traffic environment and need adults to assist them in the traffic environment.

You can teach your child the healthy habit of walking more by:

- · Walking with them the whole way to school
- · If you have to drive, park the car a few blocks away from the school and walk the rest of the way.

Regular exercise like walking with your child not only helps them (and you!) beat chronic problems like obesity, heart disease, behavioural and mental health issues and diabetes. It also gives you a great opportunity to teach your child safe ways to behave around roads and traffic.

Keep your child safe

Your primary aged child is still developing an understanding of danger and safety. While they are often keen to do things for themselves, **an adult must always be responsible for your child in the traffic environment**.

Your child is a vulnerable road user. They are still developing the skills that help them to judge the direction of sound and the speed and distance of vehicles. Your child is physically small, making it harder for drivers to see them. They may be easily distracted and tend to only be able to focus on one thing at a time. This means that they find it difficult to deal with sudden changes in the traffic environment.



Walking together to and from school

Walking to and from school with your child helps ease traffic congestion, reduces your carbon footprint, promotes physical activity and provides a talking point about road safety.

When you walk with your child, talk about safe behaviour. Always demonstrate correct pedestrian behaviour. The best way you can help your child to be a safe pedestrian is to:

- give them lots of supervised practice with you or another trusted adult
- talk with and teach your child about being alert in a road environment
- always hold your child's hand
- explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross the road
- point out dangers, such as vehicles coming out of driveways
- use pedestrian crossings and traffic lights correctly
- teach your child to keep turning their head in both directions to look and listen for traffic as they cross the road
- talk with them about everything they need to think about to keep safe when walking
- explain why they should look and listen before crossing a driveway, road or carpark.
- talk with your child and reinforce **Stop! Look! Listen! Think!** every time you cross the road together
- o **STOP!** one step back from the kerb.
- o **LOOK!** continuously look both ways.
- o **LISTEN!** for the sounds of approaching traffic.
- THINK! whether it is safe to cross.

Walking together also helps you to observe if older children are ready to cross the road independently.




Every morning Mrs MacLaren or Mrs Deiri read a new book to us. Some of these books are funny. Some of them are sad. Some of them are happy books.



Check In Assessment

During Weeks 2 and 3, students in Year 4 and 6 will be completing the online Check In Assessment. This online assessment provides teachers with data relating to student performance in Reading and Numeracy.





Playing our part to build a national picture of child health

In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Some teachers have also noticed that completing the assessments made them more aware of the needs of individual children and the class as a whole and that the census results are useful in planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing class programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.


