Wheelchair Basketball Roadshow and Road Safety Last week our students had the opportunity to participate in a presentation from Wheelchair Sports NSW. They learned about disabilities and being confined to a wheelchair, were able to ask questions and play a game of wheelchair basketball. Many thanks to Wheelchair Sports NSW for providing this valuable learning opportunity. As we move into the winter holiday period, please remind your children of the road safety rules and the importance of being aware and alert at all times. Preparing for the Blacktown Festival of Performing Arts Our choir and concert band have been busily preparing this term for our performances at BFoPA 2022. So far, the choir has been rehearsing with the full massed choir remotely via Zoom. Early in Term 3 they will be rehearsing together for the first time at Vardys Road PS. Similarly, our concert band has been practicing and last week combined with the other members of our combined band (Shelley, Seven Hills North and Vardys Road) at Shelley PS for a combined practice and rehearsal. #### Got It! Tip of the Week

Emotional moments can be an opportunity to teach your child and build your relationship with them. One way to do this is spending a few minutes each day talking with your child about emotional events happening in their life. This quality time might happen after school, after dinner, or at bedtime. Not all children will want to talk openly about feelings. Be patient and try talking when you are doing something together, like driving or doing household tasks. But if they don't want to talk, it is important not to pressure them. This is not the time to discipline; it is just a time for listening and reflecting on your child's emotions. Over time, this will build your child's trust in you and help them to feel more comfortable with sharing their feelings.

## Important Information for Parents Concerning the NCCD – Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

Dear parents, guardians and carers

#### Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
