Service NSW Back to School Vouchers Just a reminder that the NSW government has approved a scheme that came into effect from 12 December 2022, whereby NSW parents can access a \$150 Premier's Back to School NSW Voucher for each child in primary school, secondary school or home-schooling in 2023.

Vouchers can go towards the cost of school uniforms, shoes, bags, textbooks, or stationery purchased from registered businesses. You can apply for the vouchers via the Service NSW app, and for more information, visit service.nsw.gov.au, call 13 77 88 or attend a Service NSW Centre.























2022 Mini-Fete Day for Lynwood Park Students
