Dear Parents and Carers What another busy and productive term of teaching, learning and having fun this has been! I must say that (except for a very few students) the children's behaviour, manners and attitude towards their learning has been exemplary this term. I am so very proud of them and what they have achieved.

Reports Yesterday, Semester One reports were sent home for you to not only be informed of your child's progress but also for you to celebrate with your child their achievements. My teachers and I are very proud of what our children have achieved - we hope you are too! Look for the positives and celebrate them. If you find a negative, encourage improvement and let your child know that you believe in them.

Kindergarten Our Kindy students have achieved a whole semester of learning at Big School. What a delightful little bunch of learners they are! They have settled in so well. Watching them navigate their way confidently around the school, it's as if they have been with us much longer. It's hard to believe, but we are now taking Kinderfarten enrolments for 2025. If you know of anyone who has a child who will be turning 5 before July 31st 2025, please encourage them to call the office for enrolment papers or better still, to enrol online. Jellybeans Music Education Program In Term 3 we will again be participating in the Jellybeans music program. This valuable and innovative way of delivering the music curriculum will be funded by the school with support from our fabulous P&C. This means that we can offer it to every student in the school, Kindergarten to Year 6, without asking parents to contribute to the cost of delivery. Participation in the program is not optional - it represents the core delivery of the music curriculum component of the Creative Arts syllabus for all students. Music education provides students with more than the basics of being able to read music notation and play an instument. Recent research conducted across schools in South Australia has highlighted that it also significantly contributes to cognitive enhancement, social skill development and personal wellbeing for students.

SchoolBytes If you haven't done so already, please download the app called SchoolBytes as soon as you can, and start using it to familiarise yourselves with its functionality. (See later in this newsletter for details.) By the end of this year, we will be conducting all financial, attendance, correspondence and administrative tasks via this app, ultimately resulting in the school becoming cash-free and paper-free for these tasks and interactions. For example, all permission notes for activities will be sent electronically and your permission to attend/participate (or otherwise) will be given electronically via the app. The same goes for any payments - whether these are for excursions, school contributions or sausage sizzles etc. All absence correspondence will also be made via the app. We will **not** have the ability to run two systems side-by-side (app-based and paper-based), so it will be in your interests to convert to the app well before the end of the year. The app is free and is easy to use. However, if you have any problems or questions, don't hesitate to contact our friendly office staff who will be only too happy to help you get started or answer your questions.

Staff Changes As you are aware, Mr Keenan became very ill at the beginning of Term 2 and had to relinguish his contract with the school for 2024. Fortunately he is on the mend and gradually regaining his health. In the meantime we were fortunate to obtain the services of Mr Bruce Sinclair to step in as classroom teacher for 5/6 Kalbarri towards the end of the term. We are fortunate that Mr Sinclair has agreed to carry on with this teaching role in Term 3. Please make Mr Sinclair feel welcome if you see him out and about on the playground and remind him what a wonderful little school community we have here at Lynwood Park PS.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes: • year of schooling

• category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional

• level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. School Bytes

Thank you to all parents/caregivers that have signed up to School Bytes. We hope you are finding this a quicker and more efficient way to receive information, give permission for excursions and make payments online. Please ensure you have **push notifications** enabled on your phone. Thank you for your patience as we iron out any issues during the changeover.

Late arrivals and Absences

As of day 1 Term 3, we will be switching over to School Bytes for all school related communications.

All children are expected to be at school and at their classroom lines by the time the bell/music is finished at 9am. If your child arrives after this, they will be sent to the school office for a "late card". You will then get a notification on your School Bytes app to advise of your child's late arrival and it is expected that a reason is submitted back. This will also occur for any absences. If your child is not at school, you will receive a notification on school bytes on the day of that absence to explain why they are not at school. If no explanation is received, it will default to an "unexplained absence". No yellow absence notes will be sent out from Term 3.

Please be reminded that if your child has 3 or more days absent from school, a medical certificate is to be provided.

School Gates

Please be reminded that the ONLY gate open between the hours of 9.15am - 2.45pm is Frederick Street. If you need to access the school between these times for any reason including special events, you will only be able to enter by pressing the intercom at the pedestrian gate on Frederick street. The laneway gate and the Turner Street gate is only open before 9.15am and after 2.45pm. The safety of our students is our priority.

Jumpers/Jackets

As the weather gets colder, we have a lot of students coming in for jackets or jumpers. We have minimal supplies in the office, so please encourage your child to dress for the colder weather. If you need to purchase a jumper or jacket for your child, please order through the uniform shop or the P&C store.

Communication Box

There is a communication box located in the office for any money or notes. Please remind your child to come in to the office before heading to class to drop off any of these things.

Early Leavers

If you need to pick your child up early from school for any reason, please either call the school office - 9622 2659 or send an email to the school email lynwoodpk-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au to advise of this so that we can have your child ready for when you arrive.

Leave Requests

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during a school term is necessary, an Application for Extended Leave must be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year. Please contact the school office *prior* to travel for an application form or access the document on your School Bytes portal under resources. Approval is at the discretion of the school Principal. Families need also to be aware that periodically, school leave approval documents may be requested by authorities at Australian airports and sea terminals. Failure to produce this documentation could upset travel plans.
